She worked as an associate at the Hamburg office of the international law firm Luther, advising and representing clients in disputes before arbitral tribunals (DIS, ICSID) and state courts. Her practice focused on commercial and corporate disputes, as well as disputes in the energy and infrastructure sectors, and international investment disputes.

As a German national, Marie-Christin studied law with an emphasis on private international law and commercial law at the University of Passau. She completed her legal training in Germany, among others at the law firm Martens Lawyers in Munich and at the Hamburg Sports Agency. She further holds a Ph.D. (Dr. iur.) in international sports arbitration from the University of Bern (Switzerland) and a master's degree (LL.M.) from Bond University (Australia) with a focus on dispute resolution.
